


The Friends of Christ Church, Eaton

Chair's Report to the Fourth Annual Meeting, 8 September 2023



The last year has seen a continued return to normality after the COVID lockdowns and I am delighted to report that the number of Friends of Christ Church continues to grow.



2022/23 Project

Our 2022/23 project has been to install a hard-standing path for the Garden of Remembrance on the south side of the church, replacing the loose pea shingle and making it easier and safer for visitors to access the Garden, especially those with mobility issues. It was also agreed that the wooden edging in the Garden of Remembrance, which was rotting, should be replaced with something which was both environmentally friendly and durable.



I am delighted to tell you that the work was finally completed, and the path successfully installed, in July this year.

As you will be aware, we had hoped the project would be completed last year, but we faced significant challenges and delays due to water meters and pipework issues, requiring lengthy negotiations with Anglian Water, which pushed the project into 2023.

Due to rising costs as a result of the lengthy delay the final cost of the project rose to £8,766 (including VAT). With the 2022 donations already received, we have raised £2,000 towards this so far and, as ever, our aim is to contribute as much as we can towards the total.

Social Events

The majority of monies raised in 2022 came from generous donations and collections but, as we moved into 2023, we held two fundraising events: a Quiz and Chips Night on 11 March and a Plant Sale on 20 May. The Quiz and Chips night raised £519 and the Plant Sale £612. The social events included the successful and well-attended 2022 Annual Meeting and Reception on 7 September and they offered an opportunity to meet together and socialise once more – an important element of the Friends' work. The Friends of Christ Church was set up in January 2018 to help support the work of preserving and maintaining the church and its surrounds and to engage more fully with the local community.

The money we raise is used solely to preserve this important part of our local heritage by keeping the building in good condition for the use, enjoyment and appreciation of everyone, whether a churchgoer or not. Monies are therefore kept in a restricted fund.

In 2022 it was agreed that all monies held (from fundraising, subscriptions, GiftAid reclaim) would be released from the restricted funds for projects it helped to fund (repairing the chancel arch and south aisle walls, repairs to the boiler room and the chancel windows) and this has been done.
