Harvest Weekend - 19th and 20th September

This year we will be celebrating Harvest on 20th September. We will be making donations of Foodbank-type harvest produce to local charities - St Martin's Housing Trust (routes out of homelessness), YMCA My Place (housing for 16-25 year olds with housing related support) and Leeway (domestic violence).

There will be collection boxes in church for non-perishable items on 6th and 13th September - or you can bring your gifts of produce, including fruit and vegetables, to the church on 20th September.

Gifts of fresh produce such as potatoes and carrots, onions, apples, oranges and non-perishable foods - long-life milk, long-life fruit juice, tinned meat (hotdogs, meatballs etc), tinned fruit, tinned vegetables, jams and spreads, sponge/rice puddings, small jars of coffee, pasta sauce, small cereal variety boxes, tinned fish are all greatly valued.
